#### **DOG FOULING**

In previous issues we have asked all dog owners to act responsibly and pick up any mess that their dog makes. Whilst the majority of dog owners appear to act responsibly a minority are not and give dog owners a bad name.

We have received complaints during the last few weeks from areas including the Playing Field, Crossfields, and Townfield Lane. One unfortunate child fell in a dog deposit whilst in Townfield Lane during Half Term.

All dog owners should act responsibly and pick up any mess that their pet makes. This is not just the law (with a likely £1,000 fine) but a health issue.

Allowing dogs off the lead on the Playing Field is also breaking the law.
