SPEEDING REVIEW

Our PCSO has carried out a number of speed checks within the Parish over the last few months. Results have included the following:

Cross Lanes between Tarvin and Oscroft:

4th June - 21 vehicles, none exceeded the 40mph limit.

26th June - 18 vehicles, none exceeded the 40mph limit.

10th September - 31 vehicles, none exceeded the 40mph limit.

A54 Holme Street – 40mph - 436 vehicles checked – 3 exceeded the speed limit.
